He grew up in the Crow Creek district of the Hunkpati Oyate (Crow Creek Tribal Nation). Kenneth believes that he is a self taught artist and states further that he had a good childhood being brought up in a way to help others through his artwork and heal them in ways that matter. He does his best to give back to his people so that everyone can feel the same blessings. Kenneth states that he was 27 when he discovered his talent. He does state that he took art lessons at the Oscar Howe summer camp at the University of South Dakota when he was in High School at Mitchell SD. He is following in his Father's (Lyle Miller) footsteps and is doing his best to share his gift. Kenneth is following the traditional Pictograph style of artwork which uses an image to create and express an idea or information. Many of Kenneth's pieces are relatively small in size - measuring only 10x10 inch. The ones at the bottom of this page are 24"x16".
